

Figure 11 - Publication metrics used for research careers


Based on survey question 8a, multiple-choice (cf. Annex 1). Number of respondents: 185/186

## Design process

- Iterative participatory design process
- Informed by nearly 75 individuals in 26 countries and 6 continents
- resulted in a rubric that aims to support the development of responsible research assessment practices across a variety of institutional contexts and geographies

## Two possibilities for use

- Establish a baseline for the current state of institutional ability to support the development and implementation of new academic assessment practices
- 2. Retroactively analyze how the outcomes of specific interventions related to academic assessment have been helped or hindered by strengths or weaknesses within the institution

The rubric is expressly not intended as a prescriptive mechanism, or to pass judgment on an institution's current state of academic assessment.

**Goal**: help institutional leaders reflect on current capabilities to support values-driven assessment practices, and where to focus efforts to further evolve them.

#### **ALIGNMENT** ON VALUES AND GOALS

THIS MIGHT LOOK LIKE..

Standards are explicitly designed and articulated to align with institutional mission and values, such as increasing equity and support for traditionally underrepresented, minoritized groups

New standards for scholarship consider the balance across research, teaching, and service contributions including training, mentoring and good citizenship

Specific definitions and standards of "quality" with regard to scholarship are articulated and shared across disciplines and review/promotion committees

#### **DIVERSIFICATION OF STANDARDS**

THIS MIGHT LOOK LIKE...

Scholarship is assessed using diverse indicators (e.g. societal impact), units of assessment (e.g. full body of work v. individual articles), and forms of output (e.g. non-journal contributions)

Indicators of quality recognize non-individualized activities and accomplishments like team science

New definitions of "scholarship" are deployed across the full range of institutional disciplines

#### **ADOPTION OF NEW PRACTICES**

Faculty have the ability to customize success measures to reflect their research interests and goals

New standards, definitions, and criteria for evaluating the quality and impact of scholarship are integrated into the language and processes of new assessment practices
